As you know, our Pastor plans the message topics more than a year in advance. However, it just so happens that we are between sermon series this Sunday, so I thought I'd do something a bit different.

You are going to want to take some notes today because I'm going to point out some practical ways you can have a better life. A write-up of this message is already available on our website, FBCLV.com under Resources, so you can follow along.

To get us started, I wanted us to look at a couple of verses.

# Romans 5:8 (NIV84)

<sup>8</sup> But God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us.

So, the first thing to notice is that <u>God loves you</u> so much He came to earth to show us His love and give His life for us. So, if He did all that, do you think He wants you to have a good life? I know it is difficult for many of us to wrap our minds around the idea of a perfect, loving Father. We need to be careful not to apply the failings of our own fathers to God, the perfect loving Father. The Bible tells us that God is Love. Therefore, He can't do anything but love us! And just like any loving parent, He wants us to have the best life possible.

# Zephaniah 3:17 (NIV84)

<sup>17</sup> The LORD your God is with you, he is mighty to save. He will take great delight in you, he will quiet you with his love, he will rejoice over you with singing."

Imagine a parent singing over their child. My wife Alison would sit and rock our daughter to sleep every night, singing over her. And she did that as long as our daughter would let her! Believe it or not, understand it or not, God loves you infinitely more than that!

Look at another verse:

# John 10:10 (NKJV)

<sup>10</sup> The thief does not come except to steal, and to kill, and to destroy. I have come that they may have life, and <u>that they may have *it* more</u> <u>abundantly</u>.

What would you call an "abundant life?" Being human, we often think that an abundant life is one with lots of money. However, if you look at our world, we find that there are many, many people that have lots of money and zero happiness in their lives. So, this doesn't mean money. It doesn't mean things. What does it mean?

Think for a moment that you are on your deathbed and you want to be surrounded by the things in your life that have the most meaning to you. What would that include? What in your human existence would be valuable to you at that moment?

Relationships. You would want to be surrounded by love. The love of your family, the love of your friends, and most of all, the love of the Creator of the Universe who gave His life for you He loved you so much! So, we see that an abundant life is one full of love. So, if God wants us to be surrounded by love, why are there so many bad things in our lives? Look at another verse.

# **Psalm 37:25** (NIV84)

<sup>25</sup> I was young and now I am old, yet I have never seen the righteous forsaken or their children begging bread.

The righteous people in this verse are those that are "right" with God. Through the salvation offered in Jesus Christ, we are made "right" with God. Please notice this verse doesn't say the "righteous won't be begging for bread." It says their children will not be begging for bread. This means, that you and I will have difficulties in our lives, but God will always make sure our children are taken care of as we are faithful to Him. Here is another verse.

# 2 Corinthians 5:17 (NIV84)

<sup>17</sup> Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; the old has gone, the new has come!

The Bible tells us that we are all God's creation. However, only those that choose to follow Him are adopted into His family, becoming one of His children. Think of a Robot builder. Imagine how much more he loves his own children than a machine he can program to say, "I love you." If the house catches on fire, he's going to get his children out first! The same is true when we are children of God.

There are many reasons we have difficulty in our lives. Some of which we have no control over. Think about a life with no difficulties. That would be pretty boring! The difficulties in our lives make it interesting and make us stronger as we go through them. God allows difficulties in our lives to make us stronger! Like any good parent, He wants His children to grow up strong.

One more point here. God did not create evil. Evil is simply the absence of God. Where He is not, there is evil. Darkness doesn't exist either. It is the absence of light that we call darkness. So, the evil in our world is related to people pushing God away. But, setting aside the bad things that just happen to us, we need to consider the trouble we bring on ourselves. This verse reminds us that we are a new creation! When we are saved by Christ, we are re-born as a new creation. The problem is that we keep pulling our old-selfs back into our lives.

Imagine a butterfly in a cocoon. We understand that the difficulty the butterfly has getting out of the cocoon is what makes the blood flow into his wings. He must go through that struggle to survive. What if, instead of the butterfly breaking out of the cocoon, he keeps trying to pull that old cocoon back over himself. This is very often what we do to ourselves.

If you were to examine your life, you would find that only about 20% of the decisions you make in your life result in about 80% of the trouble in your life!

#### A Better Life

Make good decisions and choices through Jesus Christ.

What does this tell us? We can have a better life if we would just make better decisions. Really! We want to rationalize this away and blame our troubles on anyone or anything other than ourselves. But we know it is our own choices that determine our quality of life.

So, how can we make better decisions? Change is hard. The old saying, "you can't teach an old dog new tricks" pretty much rules our thinking. But this isn't true. New habits, good habits can turn our lives around.

Scientists tell us that there is a 21/90 rule in forming habits. It takes 21 days to form a new habit and 90 days to make it permanent. Ok, so we can do that, right?

We have to be careful in removing bad habits from our lives. We as humans work at stopping a bad habit only to find that it has been replaced by another bad habit! So, one of the primary concepts in getting rid of bad habits, is to always replace a bad habit with a good one.

I want to give you some practical resources that you can use to make a better life. Another way that church people would say this is that I'm going to stop preaching and start meddling in your business!

**Better Life Resources** Guard your heart! Christian media

First, think about what you are taking into your mind. The media we take in changes our thought processes whether we like it or not. We need to guard our hearts. Once we take it in, it is very difficult to get it out!

During my school years, I listened to Country Music. You know, "somebody did somebody wrong" songs or "Married, but not to each other" songs. During my college years, Christian Radio became popular and finally there was a Godly alternative!

Many men I've taught over the years have gone home and told their wives, we need to buy a DVR! They are so common now in homes, that it's not quite such a big deal. But one way to control what you watch is to only watch things that you have recorded. This means you made the decision to watch this TV show when you were thinking clearly and not when you were channel surfing at 2am!

So, there are two things you can do to get you started: Choose to only listen to Christian music and only watch what you have previously recorded. Better Life Resources Guard your Heart! Christian Media Sweet Thoughts Make Lists

Here are some more ideas. Many times we find ourselves down or pulling away from God. When this happens, we need to take action before we walk too far on the other side of the fence and step in something smelly! There are many more blessings close to our Savior than when we are wondering away from Him.

In our Bible Study class, we made "Sweet Thoughts" jars It is a jar filled with pieces of paper, each containing a Bible verse, promises from our Lord! "Take one to stop Stinkin' Thinkin." Every time you start feeling alone or unloved, take one!

Other things you can do includes making lists. Make a list of your questions for God. Leave some space below each one so you can write the answers God gives you in the future. Make a list of the troubles that God has brought you through. Write down how God is using it for good in your life or someone else's. List the blessings God has poured out on you. We humans have to come to worship each Sunday because we quickly forget all that the Lord has done for us!

Develop an "Attitude of Gratitude." Make the decision to thank God every time you see a blessing. When you wake up and see the sun, thank the Lord. See, you can truly spend your day being thankful for everything you see. Develop an "Attitude of Gratitude."

Take them some cookies or a cake. As you bless others, as you see their circumstances, your own troubles will melt away and seem quite small.

I think often of the movie "Anna and the King." In the movie, if you approach the King's Throne without being called, they kill you immediately. However, at one point in the move, the King's little daughter comes running in and runs right up to the throne and climbs up into the King's lap. This is the picture I want you to have in regard to your relationship with God. Through Jesus Christ, we are made a child of God and we can run up to His throne and we can cry out to Him saying "Daddy, I need you!" I want you to realize that in Christ you are a child of the King of the Universe. Live like it! Let's look at one final verse.

**Philippians 4:8–9** (NIV84) <sup>8</sup> Finally, brothers, whatever is true, whatever is noble, whatever is right, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is admirable—if anything is excellent or praiseworthy—think about such things. <sup>9</sup> Whatever you have learned or received or heard from me, or seen in me—put it into practice. And the God of peace will be with you.

Are you looking for the peace of God? This is how you get it. Whatever is true, noble, or good, think on these things! Paul said in 2 Corinthians, "we take captive every thought and make it obedient to Christ!" We need to train our minds to think on these things!
